This Course is classified as High Risk

To be eligible to qualify for a licensing outcome, you must:

1. Have photo ID
2. Reside in the NT or be a FIFO worker on an NT minesite
3. Be at least 18 years of age
4. Wear workboots, or other acceptable sturdy covered-toe footwear during the course
5. Have an acceptable understanding of written and spoken English
6. Have adequate numeracy skills to understand and perform any load calculations

Course Information

This course is held over five days:

1. the first four days are knowledge sessions, including a knowledge assessment
2. the fifth day is a performance session and a performance assessment

The course will be delivered at NATA's course delivery sites, or another suitable location as arranged with your employer. All required learning and assessment materials are supplied.

Numbers are limited to a maximum of 6 candidates.

Assessment Information

Knowledge

You will answer 77 questions in 2 hours, the test is closed book and there is no outside assistance allowed, including help from interpreters.

Performance

This assessment takes up to 2 hours and requires completion of a set of tasks using slinging techniques and signals, using a mobile crane and qualified crane driver.

Licensing Information

Upon being assessed as competent you will be given an 'Assessment Report' which is valid to use as a licence for up to 60 days. To be issued with your licence, you will need to present this paperwork to the Territory Business Centre (TBC), at 76 The Esplanade, Darwin (phone 08 8982 1700) within this 60 day period:

1. The High Risk Licence application form and signed assessment report
2. Proof of identity
3. 2 passport-sized photographs (these can be taken at the TBC)
4. \$76.00

If you fail to get your assessment information to TBC in the 60 day period, you will be asked for evidence of a current assessment, which means you will have to redo the course.

This licence is Nationally recognised and is current for a 5 year period before having to be renewed.

Statement of Attainment

On achieving competency, you will be issued a Statement of Attainment for this Unit of Competency.

RPL and Credit Transfer

Recognition of prior learning and credit transfer is not available for this unit of competency.

Course Details

The total cost for the course will be **\$1,250.00, GST exempt** (where eligible).

To confirm your place in the course we require a deposit of 50% (\$625.00), with the balance payable before course completion. Your deposit is fully refundable if for some reason NATA cancel the course.

Starting time for all five days is 8.00am, finishing time is 4.00pm.

There is a one hour break for lunch. If you require breaks from these hours for personal reasons, please talk to your trainer.
